



Admission Policy

The Christ School admits students of any race or color, national or ethnic origin to all of the rights, privileges, programs, and activities generally accorded or made available to students at the school. It does not discriminate on the basis of race or color, national or ethnic origin in administration of its admissions policies, financial assistance programs, athletics or other school-administered program.

The school prefers to admit children at the kindergarten level to help establish the foundation for further learning. Preference is given to siblings of currently enrolled students. When considering candidates for enrollment, the Admission and Academic Team assesses applications on the basis of the school's guidelines for placement.

Applicants should generally score in the 60th percentile and above on reputable standardized tests (SAT, Iowa, FCAT, Terra Nova, CTP, etc.). Students with learning disabilities may be denied enrollment if it is determined the needs exceed the scope and resources the school is able to provide without altering its academic program. Behavior expectations that align with The Christ School Mission and Vision are considered when recommending a student for acceptance and enrollment into The Christ School.

Serving Students with Learning Disabilities

The Christ School serves students with various learning styles, including those diagnosed with learning disabilities, who are able to work successfully at their assigned grade level and with limited academic support. Parents of children with learning disabilities who are admitted to The Christ School agree to work with the Student Support Specialist to develop a Student Academic Plan that outlines reasonable accommodations. TCS offers limited support services for a fee, including progress monitoring and Learning Strategies. The Academic Office also provides parents with referrals for outside evaluation and therapies. Therapists who work with students for Speech and Language, Cognitive, Occupational, Physical, Behavioral, Emotional and/or Social therapies may be approved to meet with students on campus after completing the required paperwork, including a background screening with a vendor designated by the school. Parents contract directly with the therapist for services and fees. Therapists pay a nominal fee for the use of space that may be added to the fee charged the parent for services rendered to the student.
